FROM THE PASTOR

THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT

We begin the reading of the Sermon on the Mount this Sunday. It will go on for several weeks but will be interrupted by the Lenten and Easter Seasons. We resume those readings after Pentecost.

The Sermon of the Mount is Chapters 5, 6 and 7 of the Gospel of Matthew, and contain some of the most important spiritual teaching of Jesus in the New Testament. Our Gospel reading today introduces the Sermon as we see Jesus go up onto the mountain and sit down. This reminds us of Moses, the great Lawgiver, who went up onto Mount Sinai to receive the Ten Commandments, and brings them down to the Hebrews waiting at the base of the mountain.

Jesus goes up the mountain and sits down. In that time, a teacher would sit, and the students would stand. Sitting was a sign of His authority. We still see this in our own time, as the head of a committee is referred to as the chairperson. In universities, the head of a particular school of education is the Chair. So, Jesus begins to teach.

His first teachings in the Sermon are the Beatitudes (Blessings). He begins, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of God." The further Beatitudes identify groups of people who are materially or spiritually poor, and how they are blessed. The rest of the Sermon flows from this idea of the Poor in Spirit.

Get out your Bible and go to Matthew Six. Read the Sermon. Read it again. And then read it section by section.

Then go back and read it over and over again for the rest of your life!!!

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Tomorrow, Monday, February 2, is the Feast of the Presentation. It is also called Candlemas Day, because we bless candles for use throughout the year, and it is known as Little Christmas, because it is a brief, one day, reprise of the Christmas story. We have kept our Christmas decorations up, waiting for the feast.

The Gospel for that day tells of the Joseph and Mary bringing Jesus to the Temple to consecrate Him to the Lord as their firstborn child. Recall that the firstborn of the Egyptians died in the Tenth Plague, the night of Passover. The Hebrews were spared this fate, and they were set free to leave Egypt. Every Hebrew family was required then to bring their firstborn son to the Temple, and to give him to God. He belonged to God because they had been spared this terrible fate.

After presenting the child, the family would buy him back with some sacrifice, depending on the financial position of the family. For a poor family, like Mary and Joseph, the price was two doves. This purchase of their child was called "redeeming" the child.

After they present the child, Simeon, who was promised that he would not die until he witnessed the coming of the Messiah to the Temple, referred to the child as a "light to the nations."

The Church blesses candles on this day, that will be used throughout the coming year. If you have candles that you wish to use at home, bring them to Mass that day, and I will bless them, along with the candles we will be using here at church over the coming year.

SAINT BLAISE, BISHOP AND MARTYR

On Tuesday, February 3, we celebrate the Feast of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. On that day we use candles blessed on the Feast of the Presentation, to bless throats, using the blessing, "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, may God deliver you from all ailments of the throat, and from every other evil, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

Join us at Mass that day for the Blessing of Throats.

We will also do the Blessing of Throats next Sunday, February 8.

JUBILEE YEAR OF SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI

Pope Leo XIV has declared a Jubilee of Saint Francis of Assisi, as we celebrate the 800th anniversary of the year of his death. Saints are usually celebrated on the day of their death, as that is the day on which they entered into Heaven, actually becoming saints. Francis died on October 4, 1226. The Jubilee began on January 10, 2026 and will end on January 10, 2027.

As part of our celebrations of Saint Francis, I will do a series of six talks on Francis during Lent. As usual, the talks will be at 10:30 am and 6:30 pm on Thursdays, beginning on February 19, the day after Ash Wednesday.
