**MOTHER OF GOD CHURCH****PURPOSE STATEMENT**

We, the people of Mother of God Church, aspire to be instruments of the peace of Jesus Christ by:

- Worshipping God with joy and reverence
- Welcoming the stranger with love and compassion
- Serving those in need with humility and respect.

**FROM THE PASTOR****GETTING READY FOR LENT**

Lent begins this Wednesday. This is a season when we prepare ourselves for the celebration of Easter and the Sacraments of Initiation. All too often, I think people look at Lent as just a burden laid upon us by the Church, rather than as a time to grow in our relationship with Christ, and to open ourselves to the graces of God in a fuller and more wondrous way than ever before. I hope that we can experience this Lent as a time of blessing and joy.

Certainly, there is a penitential aspect to the season of Lent. That is why the priest wears purple during this time. It is a call to conversion, to deepen our love for Christ and for His Gospel. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is highly encouraged during Lent, especially for anyone who has been away from that Sacrament for some time. Jesus Himself gave us this Sacrament on that first Easter night when He appeared to the Apostles, breathed on them, and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you shall forgive are forgiven them. Whose sins you shall retain are retained." Please plan to go to Confession sometime during this Lent.

There are also the three disciplines of Lent – Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. These are practices that we should be engaged in throughout the year, but we focus on them especially during this time.

Prayer – To grow in relationship with Christ, we must spend time with Him. In prayer, we listen to Christ (especially if we are praying with Scripture) and sharing our own hearts with Him. One saint defined prayer as, "Heart speaks to Heart." I suggest at least fifteen minutes a day in prayer. It does not matter what prayer it is (Scripture, the Rosary, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, etc.). But pray, pray, pray. If you are already spending time in prayer, consider adding time to what you are already doing, and try to focus on praying better, with greater attention and devotion.

A traditional Lenten prayer is The Stations of the Cross, when we reflect on the fourteen moments of Jesus' journey

to Calvary. Deacon Brian will offer the Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent, immediately after the 12:05 pm Mass.

Fasting – The discipline of fasting includes those specific acts of fasting and abstinence that the Church requires of us, and the tradition of giving something up during Lent. Catholics who are 14 years old or older are asked to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all of the Fridays of Lent. Catholics who are 14 to 59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday – eating only one full meal, and two smaller meals that do not add up to a full meal. When we catch ourselves feeling hunger or wanting meat, we are reminded of the deeper hunger for God. "Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God."

Almsgiving – Traditionally, almsgiving is about giving money to the poor. But it also includes all acts of charity that we provide to those who are needy. This can include visits or calls to the sick and shut-ins, helping the elder neighbor, dropping off food for a family that is going through a health situation. The possibilities are endless. Remember last week when Jesus told us that we are to be the Light of the World and the Salt of the Earth.

**ASH WEDNESDAY**

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, this year on February 18. At the Mass for that day, we receive ashes on our foreheads. In Jesus' time, those who were grieving, or who were expressing sorrow or regret, would put ashes on their heads as an outer expression of their inner sadness. We are reminded by the minister who gives us the ashes, "Remember, you are dust, and to dust you shall return." As morbid as that might sound, it is a reminder that this body will one day pass away, but that we have an immortal soul that will go on and on. Therefore, we should take care of our soul with all of the concern and attention as we do our bodies.

As I noted above, Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. All Catholics over the age of 14 are to abstain from meat that day, and those 14 to 59 fast that day, eating one full meal, and two smaller meals that do not add up to a full meal.

**SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI**

During Lent, I will be doing a series of talks on Thursdays at 10:30 am and 6:30 pm on Saint Francis of Assisi. Pope Leo has declared 2026 to be a Jubilee Year of Saint Francis of Assisi, as we honor the 800th anniversary of his death.

Francis is the most popular saint, after the Blessed Mother, in the history of the Church. This "Little Poor Man of Christ" embraced a life of radical simplicity, abandoning all possessions, so that he could proclaim that the only thing he possessed was Christ Himself. All too often, Francis is romanticized and sentimentalized, stripping him of his ability to challenge us and our own values. He is turned into a "bird bath" saint. I will try not to repeat that mistake.

I hope to see many of you here for those sessions. The first, this Thursday, February 19, I will give an overview of the life of Francis, that will set up a context for the other talks.

#### RITE OF ELECTION

On the First Sunday of Lent, all Catechumens and Candidates gather with Bishop Iffert at the Cathedral to celebrate the Rite of Election. At this ceremony, each will come forward to the bishop, who will accept them as those who will enter the Church at the Easter Vigil. On Sunday morning, at the 11:30 am Mass, we will celebrate the Rite of Sending for Election.






