Chapter 5

1. After reading this chapter, is there anyone who came to mind that you feel the need to speak Christ to?
2. Read Deuteronomy 1:19-46. What was the Israelites' consequence for letting their fear take over their faith? What can we learn from their story?
3. Reflect on this quote: "We have to come to the point in our lives where we decide to love God fiercely or not at all. Everything flows from this choice" (p. 121). How does this challenge us in our decisions and how we live our lives?
4. If we don't think we fiercely love God but want to, how do we grow to love God more?
5. According to the author, what does she say will uncomplicate our lives (p. 125)? What does she mean by this?

6. Reflect on this quote: “When we live fiercely loyal to God, we will say the hard, unpopular things because our loyalty to God supersedes our need to be liked. We won’t want to dishonor God or diminish His place in our lives” (p. 126). What would living like this look like?
7. How does remembering what God has done in the past help us stay fiercely loyal in the present? What are the dangers of forgetting what God has done?
8. Reflect on this quote: “The only certain thing is Jesus and no matter what, as a believer in Him, the knowledge for us that in the end we will be okay” (p. 127). How should this reminder give us hope, comfort, and strength to “go on record” for Jesus?
