What did you hear in this sermon that applied the most to your own life?

Describe a time in your life where something Jesus did or said was confusing. How did you respond to that confusion? How can this be something that works out for your good?

Have you ever felt that Jesus owes you something? What was it that you did that made you think he owed you? What did you feel like you were owed? What do those two things tell you about what you value and how you perceive Jesus?

We discussed three practical applications:

1. Our commitment is to God above all else.
2. We might confuse non-believers and that's ok.
3. Cling to Jesus in the confusion.

Which of these can you grow in the most? Which one are you doing already? How are you doing it? What are some practical ways that you can accomplish each of them?
