The morning of Shelleys baptism she had an air of excitement around her like a little kid getting ready for her birthday party. She had just recently given her life over to the care of Jesus Christ. When she came to the Mission two months ago she had been fleeing a both physically and mentally abusive relationship.

Shelly had started using Methamphetamine seven years ago. But with drugs nothing ever gets better and she kept asking her boyfriend “maybe life would get better if we stopped.” Then her son passed. Then her father passed. The abuse continued to get worse and she felt completely alone and became suicidal.

Desperate she reached out to a place she remembered years ago the Mission. God removed her desire for Methamphetamine and began the healing process. She is now enrolled in treatment services and is part of the Discipleship program here at the Mission.
