This Week's Scripture Readings

Philippians 3:17-4:1

¹⁷ Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. ¹⁸ For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. ¹⁹ Their end is destruction, their god is the belly, and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. ²⁰ But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. ²¹ He will transform the body of our humiliation that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself.

13th Annual Sew-a-Thon

The Mission Sewing Circle would like to thank all who worked to make the 2024 Sew-a-thon a success. It really is a team effort and takes many hands to make it happen. We would especially like to thank Shirley Dukes and her cooking team for preparing the delicious lunch.

Now for the figures: 107 participated by sewing, tying quilts, ironing, cooking and in various other ways. There were men who ironed, tied quilts, worked in the kitchen, lifted sewing machines out of trunks to deliver them to sewing tables and hooked up electrical cords and power strips. Their help was greatly appreciated. Ten quilts were tied and 28 quilt tops were sewn to various stages of construction. The Mission Sewing Circle will spend the next few months completing them. Thirty completed quilts were given to Bags of Love following the Sew-a-thon and \$1,177 was raised by the Silent Auction items. Cherry Perciful did a great job of keeping records of the money and Sylvia Bivens, a friend of the sewing group, tended the store. The store raised \$210. The Quilt Raffle raised \$1,015 and was won by Penny Bell. Proceeds from the Raffle went to the Forever Fund. Thank you to all who participated.

Thank you for making the 2024 Sew-a-Thon a success. We feel blessed that we can sew together to help the children of Montgomery County. Mark your calendars for the 2025 Sew-a-Thon. It is always held the last Saturday of February. Hope to see you in 2025.



Easter Lilies

History, mythology, and art are filled with stories and images that speak of the beauty and majesty of these elegant white flowers. One of the most famous Biblical references is in the Sermon on the Mount, when Christ said, "Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they toil not, neither do they spin and yet Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these."

Often called the "White-Robed Apostles of Hope," lilies are said to have been found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ's agony. At Easter time, churches bank their communion tables and surround their crosses with masses of Easter Lilies, to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and hope of life everlasting.

To help bring the beauty of the lily to our church this Easter, church members may purchase a lily in memory or in honor of a loved one, a special occasion or relevant event. Simply complete the information below and enclose a check or cash in the amount of \$15 for each lily. Place your form and payment in the collection plate or return to the church office. ***All orders should be in by Thursday, March 21st.***
