

## CAPITAL CAMPAIGN KICK-OFF



March 2 marked the beginning of our congregational capital campaign, **“Gifts from the Heart to Grow His Kingdom.”** Pastor Seth’s message of the gifts offered by the wise men to Jesus rings true today for the gifts that we can offer to grow His kingdom.

### Purpose: Reduce the church’s debt

When our debt was refinanced in 2022, one of the loan stipulations was that we conduct a capital campaign within a set time.

### Goal: \$800,000 to be paid over 3 years

Visiting stewards will contact individual members to meet during March or April to provide information and answer questions.

### Benefit: More funds available for church outreach and operations

While the capital campaign is a requirement, there is a tremendous benefit. Our loan will be re-amortized so that our monthly debt service payments will decrease, and we can use these funds toward our church outreach and operations. By the end of the 3 year-campaign, we hope to save \$5,830 monthly, or almost \$70,000 annually. While our goal is \$800,000, any additional amounts received will be used for debt reduction, and we can increase the **amount of funds that can be used for God’s kingdom.**

**Individual Participation:** Please pray for your individual gift and the overall success of our campaign so that FPC-Conroe can further our outreach to grow God’s Kingdom.

### Celebration Sunday: May

In May, we will celebrate the amounts pledged for our capital campaign. Just as the wise men rejoiced, we will joyfully celebrate and pay homage to Christ with our gifts to grow His kingdom.

## 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Sew-a-Thon

The Mission Sewing Group would like to thank all who worked to make the 2025 Sew-a-Thon a success. It really is a team effort and takes many hands to make it happen. We would especially like to thank Shirley Dukes and her cooking team for preparing the delicious lunch.

The Sew-a-Thon continues to grow. This year, approximately 130 participated by sewing, tying quilts, ironing, cooking and in various other ways. There were men who ironed, tied quilts,



worked in the kitchen, lifted sewing machines out of trunks to deliver them to sewing tables and hooked up electrical cords and power strips. Their help was greatly appreciated. The sewers worked on precut quilt fabric to produce the quilt tops the Mission Sewing Group will spend the next months completing. Completed quilts will be given to Bags of Love, along with

age/gender appropriate books, games, toys and toiletry items. Funds raised through the quilt raffle, silent auction and store go to the FPC Forever Fund, Bags of Love and the Mission Sewing Group.

Thank you for making the 2025 Sew-a-Thon a success. We feel blessed we can sew together to help the children of Montgomery County.
