This Week's Scripture Readings

Jeremiah 20: 7-13

⁷ O Lord, you have enticed me, and I was enticed;
you have overpowered me, and you have prevailed.

I have become a laughingstock all day long; everyone mocks me.

⁸ **For whenever I speak, I must cry out; I must shout, "Violence and destruction!"**
For the word of the Lord has become for me a reproach and derision all day long.

⁹ **If I say, "I will not mention him or speak any more in his name,"**
then within me there is something like a burning fire shut up in my bones;
I am weary with holding it in, and I cannot.

¹⁰ **For I hear many whispering: "Terror is all around!**

**Denounce him! Let us denounce him!" All my close friends are watching for me to
stumble. "Perhaps he can be enticed, and we can prevail against him
and take our revenge on him."**

¹¹ But the Lord is with me like a terrifying warrior; therefore my persecutors will
stumble, and they will not prevail. They will be greatly shamed, for they will not
succeed. Their eternal dishonor will never be forgotten.

¹² O Lord of hosts, you test the righteous; you see the heart and the mind;
let me see your retribution upon them, for to you I have committed my cause.

¹³ Sing to the Lord: praise the Lord! For he has delivered the life of the needy
from the hands of evildoers.

Romans 6: 1-11

¹ What then are we to say? Should we continue in sin in order that grace
may increase? ² By no means! How can we who died to sin go on living in
it? ³ Do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were
baptized into his death? ⁴ Therefore we were buried with him by baptism into
death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Fa-
ther, so we also might walk in newness of life.

⁵ For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly
be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶ We know that our old self was
crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, so we might no
longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷ For whoever has died is freed from sin. ⁸ But if we
died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹ We know that
Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has
dominion over him. ¹⁰ The death he died, he died to sin once for all, but the life
he lives, he lives to God. ¹¹ So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin
and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Welcome to Our New Music Director, Bonnie Hernandez



Bonnie Hernandez recently served as the Handbell Director and Children's Choir Director at Windwood Presbyterian Church, where she served for 16 years. Bonnie has also been a music educator for the last 24 years. She has taught every level from pre-k through high school in public schools.

Bonnie started her choral directing career at Hillside United Methodist Church while in college at University of Minnesota Duluth, where she earned her BA in Music Education with a Choral Emphasis. Bonnie started her teaching career in Alief ISD where she started teaching junior high choir and handbells. In 2005, she moved to Tomball and started teaching in Magnolia. In 2008, she connected with Windwood and began directing the handbells and singing as a section leader, helping lead sectionals, etc. In 2013, **Bonnie was asked to lead the children's choir at Windwood and did so until 2020**, but still did musical camps for the kids the last few summers. While Bonnie worked with Magnolia High School choir, she assisted and conducted major concerts, events, and musicals, including conducting pieces at Carnegie Hall and the National Cathedral.

Bonnie recently took a new position at Lucas Middle School, in Willis, and will be teaching Choir 6-8th grade. Bonnie is married to Rigo and has two children: Garrett Hehli who will be in 7th grade, and Rosalin who will be in 4th grade this **coming school year**. **As a family, they really love to enjoy God's beauty while hiking, swimming, biking, and cooking.** Bonnie started praising God through music starting in children's choir in her church growing up, and eventually singing with her church's adult choir and singing solos for special occasions.
