This Week's Scripture Readings

Matthew 10:34-39

³⁴ **"Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth; I have not come to bring peace but a sword.**

³⁵ For I have come to set a man against his father,
and a daughter against her mother,
and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law,
³⁶ **and one's foes will be members of one's own household.**

³⁷ **"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of** me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me, ³⁸ **and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me.** ³⁹ Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it.

Exodus 32:25-35

²⁵ When Moses saw that the people were out of control (for Aaron had lost control of them, prompting derision among their enemies), ²⁶ **then Moses stood in the gate of the camp and said, "Who is on the Lord's side? Come to me!" And all the sons of Levi gathered around him.** ²⁷ **He said to them, "Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel: Put your sword on your side, each of you! Go back and forth from gate to gate throughout the camp, and each of you kill your brother, your friend, and your neighbor."** ²⁸ The sons of Levi did as Moses commanded, and about three thousand of the people fell on that day. ²⁹ Moses said, **"Today you have been ordained for the service of the Lord, each one at the cost of a son or a brother, and so have brought a blessing on yourselves this day."**

³⁰ **On the next day Moses said to the people, "You have sinned a great sin. But now I will go up to the Lord; perhaps I can make atonement for your sin."** ³¹ So Moses returned to the Lord **and said, "Alas, this people has sinned a great sin; they have made for themselves gods of gold.** ³² But now, if you will only forgive their sin—but if not, please blot me out of the book that you have written."

³³ But the Lord **said to Moses**, “**Whoever has sinned against me I** will blot out of my book.” ³⁴ But now go, lead the people to the place about which I have spoken to you; see, my angel shall go in front of you. Nevertheless, when the day for punishment comes, I will punish them **for their sin.**”

³⁵ Then the Lord sent a plague on the people, because they made the calf—the one that Aaron had made.

The Bible is chock-full of inspiring stories, compelling characters, invaluable wisdom, and most importantly the unique and authoritative witness of Jesus Christ.

But the Bible is also filled with strange stories we struggle to interpret, disturbing events that are hard to stomach, and customs so ancient and foreign that their relevance seems elusive. Some of these texts are so odd and **otherworldly that we simply don't know what to make of them.**

This sermon series is dedicated to those texts: the ones we've buried in the closet, the ones we've avoided like the plague, the ones your Sunday School teachers never mentioned.

What might these bizarre and confounding texts have to teach us? And more importantly, what might God be saying to us through them?

Debt Reduction Campaign Update – June 2025

As of June 30, we have received pledges and one-time gifts for our debt reduction campaign, totaling \$988,148! Also, the current account balance is \$175,948.47. With notice of additional incoming funds, we anticipate making a payment in July 2025 of approximately \$232,000, effectively reducing our monthly incumbrance to date by an estimated \$2,575. The Capital Campaign Committee is deeply appreciative of your continued financial commitments to reducing our indebtedness!
