¹⁵ The Lord has taken away the judgments against you; he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more.

¹⁶ **On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: "Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak.**

¹⁷ The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing

Stewardship Campaign Update

We have made a strong start to achieving a balanced budget for 2025. To date, we have received 90 pledges for slightly over \$600,800. This puts us ~90% toward that goal. There are still 20 individuals who pledged in 2024 that have not, as yet, committed to pledging for 2025. This represents a potential of \$71,500 in additional revenue. If you have already pledged to give for the 2025 Budget, thank you for your very generous support. If not, please prayerfully consider doing so. There is simply no way around the fact that achieving a **balanced budget requires everyone's financial support. If you plan to pledge but** have not done so for whatever reason, it is not too late. Either put your completed card in the collection plate on Sunday or drop it by the church office at your convenience. Our goal of a balanced budget is within our reach, so please pledge to do your part in achieving this goal.

REMINDER! For those of you who are considering donating stock to the church or making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) directly from your IRA to the church for the calendar year 2024, this memo is to remind you that the transaction must be completed by 12/31/2024 if you want the contribution to be a tax deduction for 2024. However, please try to complete transactions **before the last week in December to avoid a last minute "glitch" that may keep you** from being eligible for a 2024 tax deduction. Yvonne Rose has paperwork in the church office that facilitates the stock donation process so please feel to contact Yvonne if you wish to donate stock.

Also, for those who intend to pre-pay their pledge for 2025 in the calendar year 2024, please note that this should be completed before the last week in December as mentioned above.

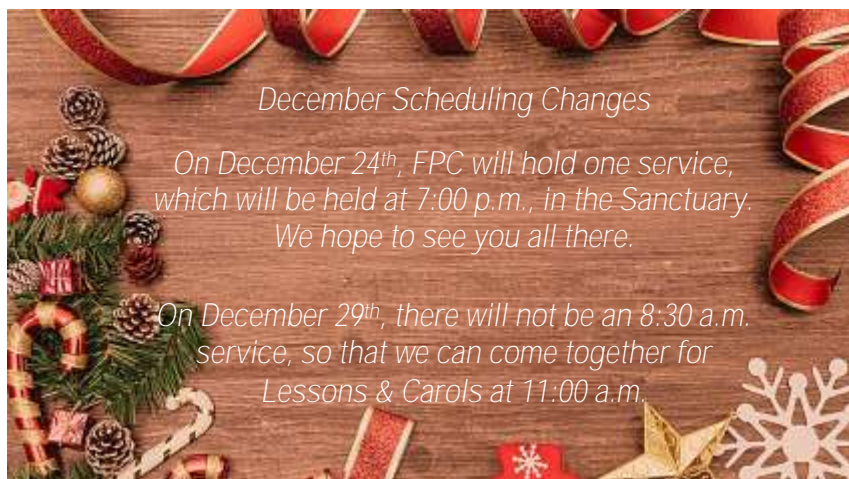
