Finish Strong to Start Strong!

We finished 2025 in remarkably healthy financial shape. Your generosity makes a great difference as we carry out God's mission for us of "Connecting People with Jesus". What was so remarkable? In the midst of our "Building a Firm Foundation" capital campaign (see more below), you also gave the most in the 128 year history of St. Stephens to support the daily mission of the congregation. In fact, we exceeded the Church's budget, which hasn't happened in many decades!

We finished strong for the year - **thank you, and God be praised!** But God is just beginning a new phase of our life together as St. Stephens. He is not finished, so neither are we! Yes, we have a bit of a buffer left from 2025, but we also have new challenges - so we need to start strong in 2026. Already, we have faced the challenge of weather disruption. Special thanks to those who give online, or to those who have made an extra effort to give your offerings even during the storms. We were, however already \$24,000 behind budget at the end of January, and since then we have missed another Sunday.

By starting strong in 2026, we can carry the mission of "Connecting People with Jesus" forward without hesitation. I pray that you have been blessed with our introduction of the book "Joining Jesus on His Mission". I know that I have enjoyed being more intentional in my conversations and prayers. It is exciting to consider that we are on a journey **with** Jesus! To that end, our new Mission & Ministry Center will serve as a hub for growing together in Christ and then being sent out to "live as everyday missionaries"!

Let me give you brief construction and funding update on our new building. The expected occupancy date has slipped a bit due to the weather and supply issues, but I think that everyone will love the new entryway with its very nice restrooms and hospitality features. The Fellowship Hall and various meeting spaces and Bible study rooms will be an excellent place for discipleship and service. A new entry into the school office will provide greater security for our students, and the new offices will serve staff, members and volunteers well. While access has been limited during construction, those who have seen the extent of the building have all remarked that it is a very good design - and the best is yet to be completed!

To put it simply, we are getting a wonderful facility for a decent price! Yes, it is still expensive, but much has been donated in terms of building design, interior design and construction management. We have some very talented members who have donated furniture and used their contacts in the industry to secure significant discounts on items to furnish the building. And, of course, we have had 223 families or individuals who have contributed financially. **To date over \$3 million has already been given** toward the approved building cost of \$4.4 million. That remaining gap is why we need to continue to be strong in our stewardship together, both in controlling costs and in giving.

So how can we "finish strong" in funding our Mission and Ministry Center, so that we may then "start strong" as we begin to us this facility to serve God's purposes? Let me share some financial data using \$1 million in debt (which is low) to simplify the illustration.

If we were to pay on that for the full term of the loan (20 years @ 6.13%) it would add more than \$736,000 in interest. With all due respect to People's Bank, we don't want that -- and historically St. Stephens doesn't do long term indebtedness.

But even paying down a \$1 million dollar debt (and remember it is likely to be a higher amount) over just a 5 year period still means accruing over \$163,000 in interest! Many people have sacrificed to raise the equivalent of \$1M/year for the last three years. Let's keep it going since this Mission & Ministry Center will benefit everyone associated with St. Stephens in one way (or in many ways!). If you are able to begin or continue your support, please do. Every gift, whether it be financial, material or spiritual, **makes a difference!** So, pray for God to do "immeasurably more than we ask or even imagine" (Eph. 3:20) as He works in, among and through each one of us!

I can imagine that we have fully funded this new facility **before the end of 2027** because it is a "Firm Foundation" for everything that comes next in our Journey with Jesus. To Him be all the glory!



The month of January has brought delays, cancellations, and rescheduling of events all due to weather. It also seems no matter how much you prepare for severe weather you're never really ready. I often think about a son and a dad sitting down and having a discussion about nothing and the son says to the dad, "Dad I got something I need to tell you." The son begins to unload a bunch of information about something his dad did not even know about. His dad was not prepared, he was surprised, and it took him time to regroup and respond in the best way he could. It's nice to know there are no surprises for God and that is a comfort for sure.

As we begin 2026, we think about the plans God has for us. We continue to forge ahead with our strategic plan. Some large items in our plan are facility needs and upgrades, school facility growth, and program growth. Our S.T.E.A.M. program that encompasses the entire school is in its second year of a three-year full implementation; this program has been well-received by all (especially the students) and continues to take hold in our daily routine. Our safety and security assessment is just about complete (waiting on the completion of our Mission and Ministry Center to include that as well). This will be invaluable as our student body and staff continue to grow. Our school is growing and we will soon need more space and more programs. To help us in determining how best to handle our blessings, Lutheran Schools Consulting Service is working with us on a feasibility study. They are working through surveys, looking at demographics, and will be on site for interviews and a campus survey. We look forward to their findings. Finally, we are upgrading our school management system and our website. This has been a year in the making and it is going to be fabulous (once we get it all figured out).

God has prepared a path for us in 2026 and there will be some surprises along the way, but with God there are no surprises. To God be the Glory.

Please continue to pray for our school ministry.


