

## It's A Wrap!

Isn't that how much of our walk with God can seem to us and what so many of us are experiencing in our lives and walk with Christ Jesus even now. We've made it to a "precipice" in our lives, a "peak", if you will, on what seems like a mountain top and one of the first thoughts that come to mind is, "That's a wrap!" But the funny thing is that from the top we see another valley ahead and guess what? You've got it. We can see we have more hills and mountains to climb and paths to travel. There's more to be done.

Life is an adventure. I'm blessed to be on this journey of life with the Greatest Guide Available. The One Who's Price is worth far more than we could ever afford on our own, and yet, He offers His services to us, having paid IN FULL the price necessary for our journey with Him and the only instruction we're given if we want this is to "**Follow Me (Him; Jesus Christ)**". What makes this offer special is that it comes with a Promise, "**and I will make you Fishers of Men**". (Matthew 4:19)

It's when you allow Jesus to lead you and help transform you into the child of God that you've been called to be, that you fully realize, this isn't a "wrap", but only the beginning of the "next production".
