* Affirmation of Faith: Adapted from The Confession of 1967, 9.08 (unison) –

In Jesus of Nazareth, true humanity was realized once for all. Jesus, a Palestinian Jew, lived among his own people and shared their needs, temptations, joys, and sorrows. He expressed the love of God in word and deed and became a brother to all kinds of sinful men and women. But his complete obedience led him into conflict with his people. His life and teaching judged their goodness, religious aspirations, and national hopes. Many rejected him and demanded his death. In giving himself freely for them, he took upon himself the judgment under which everyone stands convicted. God raised him from the dead, vindicating him as Messiah and Lord. The victim of sin became victor, and won the victory over sin and death for all.

We approach God in prayer not as strangers, but as beloved children, baptized in Christ Jesus. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

As children of God, we pray for the church . . . Send us down from the holy mountain to show and tell the gospel message: the transforming power of your grace. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

As children of God, we pray for the earth . . . Let this world be transformed, transfigure. Let it shine with your majestic glory in the promise of your new creation. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

As children of God, we pray for all nations . . . Let the leaders of the earth be warned that you will thwart the plans of the wicked and restore the fortunes of the poor. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

As children of God, we pray for this community . . . Establish justice and equity in this place. Answer those who cry out to you, who call upon your name. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

As children of God, we pray for loved ones . . . Be a lamp for those who wait in darkness. Speak to them with your loving voice, so that they will not be afraid. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Holy One, as you are well pleased with Christ, help us to live in a way that will be pleasing to you. As you have called us to listen to Christ, help us to always heed his word and seek his will. These things we pray in the name of Jesus, your beloved Child, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. As Jesus called the first disciples, so he calls to us this day: Follow me. **Amen.**



New Beginnings will meet Monday, Feb. 16, at noon. Please let Tommy or Martha know you are coming.



