

LESSON 1 - FOUNDATIONS OF CHRISTIANITY

Growing Into Maturity

Christianity has foundations.

It's important to understand these foundations in order to grow into maturity.

Maturity is the goal the Lord has for us after we are born again.

We grow into the new nature that we have in Christ.

God's Desire for Our Growth

1 Thessalonians 4:1–3 shows us that God's will for believers is our **SANCTIFICATION**.

You cannot grow into maturity without a solid **FOUNDATION**.

The Foundations of Our Faith

Hebrews 6:1–2 lists the elementary teachings (the “ABCs”) of Christianity:

1. Repentance from **DEAD** works and faith toward **CHRIST**

2. Baptisms and the laying on of **HANDS**

3. Resurrection of the dead and eternal **LIFE**

A house cannot stand without a solid **FOUNDATION**. If the foundation cracks, everything built on it will eventually **FALL**.

Foundation #1 – Repentance from Dead Works

Repentance has often been misunderstood and misused, but every gift from God is **GOOD**(James 1:17).

The New Testament word repentance literally means “to **CHANGE** your **MIND**.”

Repentance is not just feeling sorry — it is choosing to agree with **GOD** about what is right, good, and best for your life.

Jesus said: “**REPENT**, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” (Matthew 4:17)

Without repentance, there is no true **SALVATION**.

Foundation #2 – Faith Toward God

Faith gives us access to **GOD** and is required to **PLEASE** God.

Faith believes that God **IS** and that He is a **REWARDER** of those who seek Him (Hebrews 11:6).

Faith comes by **HEARING** the Word of Christ (Romans 10:17).

God gives each believer a **MEASURE** of faith, and we are responsible to grow it.

Faith is not only something we believe — it is something we **SPEAK AND ACT UPON**.
