Our Stephen Ministers Are Ready to Care!

“Then they sat on the ground with him for seven days and nights. No one said a word to Job, for they saw that his suffering was too great for words.” Job 2:13 (NLT)

When you're ministering to someone in pain, you must remember this: The deeper the pain, the fewer words you use.

If you're always in a hurry, then you're never going to be a great listener. To have great conversations, you start by looking with love at the other person, but then you must invest as much time as needed. Why? Because you can't listen well in a hurry. Great listening takes time.

Job was a wealthy man who lost virtually everything, including his money, health, and even his children. *“When three of Job's friends heard of the tragedy he had suffered, they got together and traveled from their homes to comfort and console him . . . Then they sat on the ground with him for seven days and nights. No one said a word to Job, for they saw that his suffering was too great for words”* (Job 2:11, 13 NLT).

This is called the ministry of presence. When you're ministering to someone in pain, you must remember this: The deeper the pain, the fewer words you use. If somebody's having a bad hair day, then you can talk about it for 30 minutes. But if that person has a major crisis, talking about it for a long time is probably not going to help. The truth is that you don't need to say anything. Just show up and shut up. You can't talk people out of their pain. Some pain is beyond words. This kind of investment takes time. Notice how many days Job's friends sat on the ground with him . . . seven. Do you have anybody in your life who'd sit on the ground with you for seven days without saying anything?

Stephen Ministers are members of Trinity who have been through extensive training and provide confidential, one-to-one, Christian care to people who are experiencing a difficult time. They listen, care, encourage, pray, and provide weekly support for as long as the need persists. CROP Walk Success!

Thanks to all of you who supported and/or attended the West Seneca Community of Churches Chicken BBQ/CROP WALK on 8/24/25. It was a great success - plans are being considered for doing it again in 2026.

Over \$ 3000 was raised by walkers for the CROP WALK - a percentage of that will come right back to the West Seneca Food Pantry.

Over \$ 2000 was also raised for the West Seneca Community of Churches for use here in our community. \$500 of that amount was given to the WS Food pantry. This will be used for produce and dairy, as needed. \$500 was given as to the National CROP WALK organization. \$250 was given to the home-bound meal service program run by volunteers from 14 Holy Helpers RC Church. This group feeds pantry clients who are home-bound and cannot shop at the pantry in person.

Cemetery Plot Increase

Effective January 1, 2026, the cost to purchase a plot in Trinity's Cemetery will be increasing.

- Members - currently \$700 per plot with a \$100 discount per plot when purchasing 2 or more at the same time. As of 1/1/26, the cost will be \$1,000 per plot with the same discount given as outlined above.
- Non-members - currently \$1,400 per plot (no discount given). As of 1/1/26, the cost will be \$2,000 per plot (no discount). Non-members must be a former Trinity member or relative of a Trinity member to purchase plots in Trinity Cemetery.

**Christmas Poinsettia Plants**

We will once again be placing poinsettia plants on the altar for Christmas services this year. Order forms can be found in upcoming weekly bulletins or you can contact the church office (674-9188).
