“Too Practical to Follow a Star”

There are many advantages to being practical. According to The Benefits of Being Practical: Navigating Life with Pragmatism, a pragmatic life leads to efficient problem-solving, enhanced time management, effective allocation of resources, reduced stress and long-term success. There are many rewards for a realistic mindset. But there are times when God invites us to the impractical. God beckons us to take the path which may not be the most logical.

Take for example the Wise Men (Matthew 2:1-12). They witnessed a star at its rising, following it to a foreign land to worship a foreign king, The King of the Jews. There was nothing logical about their journey. Instead, they followed a star on a long and arduous journey. Their reward? They met Jesus and worshipped him, offering gifts in his honor. How might God be calling you on an adventure in 2025, much like that of the wise men? After all, it is time for a new year and a new adventure. You may find that the adventure may not be the most practical, but it may be an opportunity to meet Jesus again and honor him anew.

January Mission Focus

UMCOR: ALLEVIATING SUFFERING ALL OVER THE WORLD

Originally founded in 1940 in response to displaced and vulnerable populations in the wake of World War II, **the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR)** is a ministry of The United Methodist Church through the General Board of Global Ministries. "Our goal is to assist the most vulnerable people affected by crisis or chronic need without regard to their race, religion or status. We believe all people have God-given worth and dignity."

As the humanitarian relief and development arm of The United Methodist Church, **the United Methodist Committee on Relief – UMCOR** – assists United Methodists and churches to become involved globally in direct ministry to persons in need. UMCOR comes alongside those who suffer from natural or human-caused disasters – famine, hurricane, war, flood, fire or other events – to alleviate suffering and serve as a source of help and hope for the vulnerable. UMCOR provides relief, response and long-term recovery grants when events overwhelm a community's ability to recover on their own. UMCOR provides technical support and training for partners to address emerging and ongoing issues related to disaster relief, recovery, and long-term health and development. Additionally, UMCOR supports migrants through legal and humanitarian support, as well as through global advocacy.

- **Pray:** UMCOR's work is undergirded by the power of prayer – both in the hours after a disaster strikes and through recovery.
- **Make supply kits:** Assemble relief supply kits to help keep UMCOR's Relief Supplies Network ready to deliver goods in the hands of survivors (U.S. only)
- **Volunteer:** U.S. volunteer efforts are arranged through annual conferences; reach out to your conference disaster relief coordinator to learn more.

The NAC Disaster Response Warehouse, located in Decatur, AL, is staffed by volunteers, and receives donations of disaster relief supplies based on UMCOR Standards.

During the month of January, the GFUMC Missions Team will be collecting items for UMCOR that will be donated through the NAC Disaster Response Warehouse. Watch for the list of needed items and the Red Buckets at our entrances.


Stories of Generosity from Luke
