When we think about the great command (Matthew 22:36-40), our mind typically goes to love of God and love of neighbor. Rarely do we consider “as yourself.” But we should because “loving our neighbor as yourself” is not only part of the great command, but one of those important foundational principals for our relationship with God. Individually, this is not about self-centeredness or putting ourselves ahead of God, instead it involves healthy boundaries and self-care, so that we may love our neighbor. As a foundational principle for the church it means how we love one another, inside of the church. As the body of Christ, we are called to love our neighbor outside of the church building and love one another as brothers and sisters in Christ. 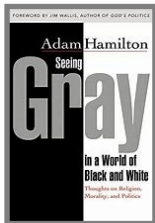

As always, I am overwhelmed by the level of generosity within the congregation. What you are doing through First United Methodist Church of Gadsden is changing lives in the name of Jesus.

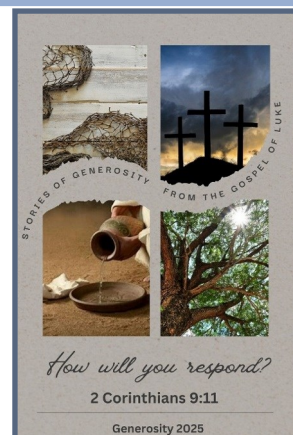

Lights, Lights, Action! New LED Lighting Brightens Our Gym

This week, the lights in our gym received a much-needed upgrade as we transitioned to energy-efficient LED fixtures. This improvement not only promises to brighten our space but also marks a significant step toward both saving money and creating a more sustainable environment for our church community.

The idea for the lighting upgrade was sparked by a simple yet impactful request from Eric Wright, during his time as Chair of the Board of Stewards. Eric posed a challenge: “What are some ideas to save the church money?” The gym lights, which had become a major cost item, were not only expensive

but also discouraged the use of the space. A suggestion was made with information found online about cost savings that could be realized by replacing the gym lights with LED lights. While the idea was being considered, Susan Swann, Church Secretary, discovered an article online detailing a similar project completed by another church, where they had successfully received a grant to upgrade their lighting system. Inspired by this example, Susan gathered information about the grant and its availability. As this opportunity was made known, the application process for the grant officially began. A huge thank you goes out to several key individuals who made this project possible: Mark Condra, our Church Treasurer, who played a pivotal role in managing and coordinating the financial aspects of the project, ensuring the process stayed on track; Mark Casey, who provided critical information about energy efficiency, cost savings, and the long-term return on investment of the project; Alan Ross, Trustees Chair

and Matthew Vance, Building Supervisor, who worked to gather the required multiple bids from contractors; and Eric Wright, whose grant writing experience was invaluable in crafting a strong proposal.

This process began with the vision and leadership of our 2024 church team, whose foresight and collaborative spirit set the foundation for the successful execution of the upgrade. The completion of this project and was made possible by our church’s investment along with approval of the grant funding. *The new LED lights will significantly reduce energy consumption and costs, with an estimated annual savings of \$4000.00, while also providing better illumination for our gym space—making it a more inviting environment for everyone who uses it.*

A special thank you to everyone who played a role in bringing this “bright idea” to life. We look forward to seeing the positive impact this upgrade will have on our church activities and the broader community.

And, of course, let’s enjoy the new lights!
