Sermon Notes: Thursday, March 28 & Sunday, March 31

Mary and the Tomb is the most prominent stained-glass window of First United Methodist Church. It is one of the largest windows and has the most noticeable spot, in the sanctuary facing Chestnut Street, easily admired from the inside and outside of the church. Like the other windows, it was designed by Joseph Victor Llorens and installed in 1936 along with eight others. The window offers the most important message of Christ' resurrection and power, reminding us that each day with Jesus is resurrection and life.

As you prepare for Easter worship, spend time with the scripture: John 20:1-18 and these questions:

1. What does resurrection mean to you?
2. How has Jesus empowered you to tell others that He lives.
3. How have you seen the Risen Lord today?

See you Sunday as we see the beauty and hear the story.






See the Beauty... Hear the Story.




Mission Focus




