Sermon Notes: Thursday, May 16 & Sunday, May 19, 2024

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday. It is a day when the church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church. We read the story of Pentecost in Acts 2:1-21. As the early followers were gathered in the Upper Room, the Holy Spirit came as a mighty wind and tongues of fire, giving each the ability to communicate in different languages. Those gathered and the power of the Spirit spilled out into the streets and 3000 were added to their number. As a part of that day, Peter acknowledged that this was a fulfillment of what was prophesized by Joel, "I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh" and "all who call on the name of the Lord will be saved."

This Sunday is also Confirmation Sunday, a day when we celebrate our students who completed the classes. Students will be recognized and prayed for at both services, with some discerning to publicly profess faith and join First United Methodist Church. We recognize in this day that God has poured His Spirit out among us, gifting all of us to be First United Methodist Church.

In response to recent tornadoes in central Alabama and central Georgia and flooding in California, the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) approved early relief grants to meet immediate needs in three annual conferences.

On Jan. 12, multiple tornadoes slammed the southeastern United States, killing at least seven and destroying numerous communities. Assessing needs in hard-hit Selma, Alabama, a leadership team from the Alabama-West Florida Conference noted that approximately 600 households were affected by more than a dozen tornadoes. "It would not surprise me," said the Rev. Chris Ackerman, conference disaster response coordinator, "if the total number of houses affected is over 1,000." "From the moment the warning was activated in Dallas County," recalled the Rev. Diane Everette, Church Street United Methodist Church, Selma, "our UMC connection stayed in touch with me to ensure that I was personally safe as well as our church members.

While Thursday was, perhaps, one of the most terrifying days of my life, I was never alone, thanks to my brothers and sisters in Christ in this conference. It will be a long road ahead for Selma, but our conference disaster response team will walk with us every step of the way."

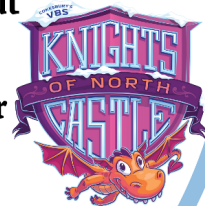

- 1 Standard Size Claw Hammer
 - 1 each: Shirt pocket notebook, permanent marker, pencil and sharpeners. (Place in a small Ziploc bag.) For "To Do" lists and marking packing boxes.
 - 1 Flashlight with batteries
 - 12 Black Trash Bags, 30-45 Gallon recommended (bundled) *for trash removal*
 - 1 Roll of Toilet Paper in a Ziploc Bag
 - 1 Pr. Leather Palm/Cloth back or All Leather Work Gloves
 - 1 50 count #8 Nails
 - 10 White 13 Gallon Kitchen Trash Bags with Draw Strings (bundled)
 - 1 Cellophane packing Tape
 - 10 One-Gallon Ziploc Bags (bundled) (For jewelry, and valuables)
 - 1 Box Cutter
 - 1 Liquid Hand Sanitizer 4 oz -12 oz
 - 1 Insect Repellent Spray Bottle/Can, Wipes or Combination
 - 1 Pr. Safety Glasses. *For hammering tarps, wood strips on roof*
 - 6 Clear Large Plastic Bags, 40-55 Gallon recommended (bundled)
 - 3 Tampons or Pads in a small Ziploc Bag

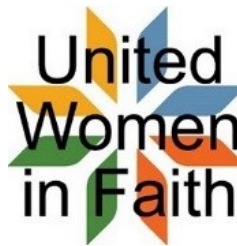

GLEN PIERSON & EVELYN PIERSON



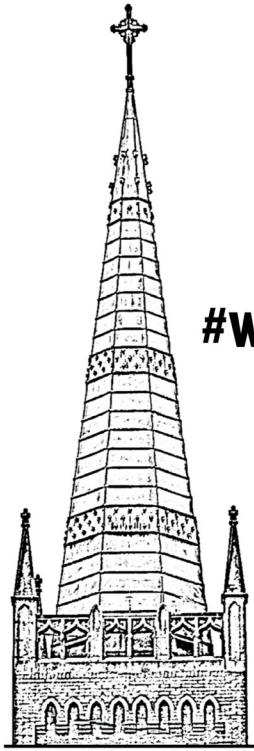
Evelyn Pierson & her son, Glen

He graduated from Auburn as a Business major, then worked as a Manager at his family’s business, Pierson Chevrolet, on Meighan Boulevard. (His sister, Fran, was active in our church until she married in 1986. Now she lives in Mobile and is active in her church there.) Evelyn grew up in Montgomery, AL, and attended Mary Baldwin College in Staunton, VA, for 2 years. She then transferred to the University of Alabama and received a Bachelor of Arts in Mathematics in 1950. She worked as a Statistician at Air Command and Staff College on Maxwell Air Force Base, then married Glenwood and lived

in Decatur, where he owned a Desoto-Plymouth dealership. In 1956, they bought the Gadsden dealership and kept it until Glenwood’s passing in 1993. Evelyn’s college friend, Carol Cross, had encouraged her to attend our church, and Evelyn has been a faithful member here for the past 67 years. Her hobbies include needlepointing and making quilts for needy babies.
