Message from Pastor Lance

As the dust has settled on 2025, my heart is full of gratitude to God for all He has done in our church and school. Like so many others, the years following the Covid season were challenging. Yet through it all, our God has remained good and firmly in control. Looking back now, it is clear that His hand has been present, not only in blessing, but also in loving correction. But at the end of the day, I realize I took many things for granted in ministry until they were stripped away.

This past year gave me a deep sense of appreciation that I struggled to put into words until my friend and missionary, James Morsey, visited and delivered his retirement message. As he reflected on a lifetime of church planting in Chile and the closing of that chapter of ministry, he shared how he came to recognize, like the Apostle Paul, that the Lord provides a specific measure of grace to fulfill the calling He gives (2 Corinthians 10:13). As James spoke, it became clear to me that the work I have been entrusted with, shepherding a local church, can only be done through God's assigned grace. I truly can do nothing apart from Jesus (John 15:5). When God's appointed grace for ministry is combined with His providential care, it changes how we see our work and our circumstances. We begin to see things from His perspective, which is peaceful, like watching the morning fog roll in to supply the assigned water to the redwoods.

That said, pastoring a local church isn't a spectator sport. While we trust in the providential hand of God, we are also called to labor faithfully. We study, preach, encourage, exhort, think, pray, and defend the truth as we lead the flock toward safety and green pastures. Our study of Screwtape Letters last Fall reminded us that there is an enemy to fight, a people to win, and saints to build up.

As we look back on the year, we can see clear evidence of growth in many areas. Our membership increased by 10 percent, attendance grew by 7 percent, and we met our financial goals. We added three new deacons, launched our Saturday Night Service, and rejoiced in the baptism of 23 individuals. Easter Sunday and Faith and Blue Sunday were also particularly encouraging and meaningful times for our church family.

As we look ahead to 2026, we are asking the Lord to continue building and strengthening our church leadership. We are praying for more people to be equipped to teach and preach expositional Bible studies. In a world filled with unlimited information, we need mature believers who can help younger believers develop discernment and clearly understand right from wrong. As a church that prioritizes the next generation, we are also praying for more help in training and discipling our children. Finally, we are asking God to bring a critical mass to our Saturday night service. While I am deeply thankful for the average attendance of around 40 this past fall, our prayerful goal for this coming year is to see 60 to 70 regular attenders.

My heart never ceases to be thankful for the privilege of shepherding the church where I was saved 30 years ago. I am confident that our time in the book of Hebrews will root us more deeply in our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Kids' Ministry

The mission of Kids' Ministry at Windsor Christian Church is to equip children to understand three essential truths:

- How to place their faith and trust in Jesus
- Who God is
- How God calls them to live

Every Sunday morning, Kids' Church meets during the main service, providing a safe, welcoming, and engaging environment for babies through fifth graders to encounter the Gospel through biblically grounded lessons, worship songs, and interactive games that reinforce each week's teaching.

Throughout 2025, children were led through a wide range of Scripture, helping them see both the unity and depth of God's Word. In Kids' Church, we began with stories from Moses, traced God's redemptive work through Israel and ended with the Israelites returning from the Exile. While largely in the Old Testament, these lessons were designed to help children understand the big picture of Scripture and how God's story points to Christ.

On Wednesday nights, Kids' Night provided additional opportunities for discipleship and growth. Over the course of the year, Landon taught the 10 Commandments, different ways God speaks, and the book of Philippians. Kids' Night also hosted a huge Trunk-or-Treat community outreach event that brought people from all over Windsor to our campus for fellowship and fun!

During the summer, our Vacation Bible School, True North, welcomed children from all over Windsor for a week filled with worship, crafts, games, and a clear presentation of the Gospel.

This past year has been marked by significant growth throughout our youth ministry. As we look ahead to 2026, our goal is to continue equipping children not only with a knowledge of God's Word, but with hearts of faith that trust in Christ for salvation, understand their purpose in following Him, and learn to listen to God's voice through the Bible.



Student Ministry

Our Youth Group has been a place of steady growth, particularly as student leadership continues to develop. Our student-led worship band gave students opportunities to serve and lead their peers. During 2025, we taught through significant portions of Scripture, including going through a systematic theology, Ruth, Jonah, and 1 & 2 Timothy, helping students see both the big picture of Scripture and its practical application to their lives. We've just begun the book of Judges and are loving the practical teachings found in the lives of those characters.

We also took students on a missions trip to serve a local church by leading a Vacation Bible School and assist with hands-on projects. This gave them a tangible way to live out their faith.

The past year in Student Ministry both began and ended with our January Winter Camp, which is a highlight for many of our students. Winter Camp continues to be a meaningful time of fellowship, a chance for students to step away from their normal routines, hear solid biblical teaching, build friendships, play games, and spend focused time growing in their faith.

This year we graduated a large class from the high school but still managed to bring structural growth by adding more junior high students. To strengthen community, we hosted additional events such as bowling nights and our annual Turkey Bowl.

As we move into 2026, our goal are to continue developing student leaders, deepening biblical understanding, and encouraging each student to grow in a genuine, resilient faith that impacts every area of their life.



Young Adults

As I reflect on this past year, I'm grateful for what God has done and confident in what He will continue to do. It has been a joy to serve in the Lord's ministry through Windsor Christian Young Adults this past year. Since I began leading this group in April, I've seen God working in real and personal ways by bringing growth, conviction, encouragement, and a deeper understanding of Scripture into the lives of the young adults who have come to our campus. He has been faithful in every way, and I've been deeply encouraged by the work He is doing in this ministry.

Over the past year, we've gone through Philippians and 1 Samuel, reminding ourselves that comfort and success aren't found in ourselves, but in knowing Christ and becoming more like Him. As we move into this new year, we are beginning a series through 1 John, 2 John, and 3 John, focusing on the call to fellowship and walking in the light.

Each Tuesday night, we begin our evening with worship. Our worship leader, Steven, helps shift our heart posture from simply singing about God to proclaiming truths about God directly to God. After worship, a lesson is taught with personal stories woven through Scripture to show how the Bible's truths are present and relevant today.

Following the message, we gather in small groups, which have become one of the most meaningful parts of our evenings. While three questions are provided, the conversations often go far beyond them. I have witnessed deep theological discussions, thoughtful comparisons to other biblical figures, and personal growth as individuals see themselves reflected in Scripture. These conversations don't end when Tuesday night does, but continue beyond our gatherings. I have been encouraged by the fellowship and community of over fifty young adults who desire to walk faithfully with Christ.

Throughout the year, we have also hosted many outreach events to help us connect more deeply with the community. From beach trips in the summer to game nights and ramen nights in the fall, there has never been a dull moment. Through social media, we have had been able to connect with young adults across Sonoma County, which has led many believers to discover and join our Young Adults group.

As we look toward the next year, our goal is to increase outreach opportunities, glorify God, and meet young adults where they are in their walk with Christ, always pointing them toward Him in every season. I am excited to see how God will continue to work in the lives of those involved in Windsor Christian Young Adults.



Adult Ministries

In 2025 we had multiple Adult Growth Groups going throughout the year. There were men's Bible studies, women's Bible studies and adult Bible studies.

Men's Ministry

Last year, the men had multiple opportunities to gather and connect. One regular opportunity was the Men's Breakfast held on the first Saturday of the month. Speakers included Windsor Christian Church members, staff employees, and individuals from outside the church. Each gave half hour presentations challenging men, high school age and up, in their daily walk. The men were also challenged with the breakfast itself each Saturday as it's prepared by men in the church.

Man Camp was held October 3-5 at Harbor Lite Lodge in Fort Bragg. The lodge provided comfortable lodging, a conference room and access to local restaurants for food and fellowship. Guest speakers, R.W. Mackey and Greg Thomas, challenged the men in their walk with Christ as men, husbands, and fathers. Great weather also allowed time for recreation or relaxation.

In 2025 adult classes varied by teacher and subject. Rhett Paro taught the Book of Titus on Sunday mornings for several months. Ted Green taught 1 and 2 John before transitioning to Galatians. On Wednesday evenings Pastor Lance began a class on Screwtape Letters with several elders and pastors each teaching a chapter. Chris Ule faithfully led the Wednesday evening Men's Bible Study for much of 2025 and the men later transitioned into the Screwtape Letters class.

Women's Ministry

Last year, there were also many opportunities for women to come together to fellowship and encourage one another in their faith journey. On the last Saturday of five months, a Women's Breakfast offered a potluck brunch and a unique and special Gospel Conversation hosted by Jill Wallace. Jill interviewed Bonnie Riley, Jana Millerick, Colleen Hartman, Betsy Irwin, and Meredith Strom. Each conversation helped us understand that as a child of God, every story is a story of God's grace.

Women's Ministry also hosted an outreach night in the form of a Bunco Game Night in March and celebrated the beginning of the Christmas season with a Cookies and Cocoa event in early December.

There were many Bible Studies for women to choose from as well. In the spring, Betty Shelton led women through The Hidden Christ of The Old Testament study. Jill Wallace and Leslie Stadium taught a study in the Book of James. Joy Hitchcock led a study in the Book of Hebrews and Bridget Consiglio led a study of Joseph in Genesis. In the fall, Betty began a study of Prophecy in the Book of Daniel and Bridget led a study on the Sermon on the Mount. Fall also brought new leaders as Jana Millerick led a morning study through Philippians, Susan Freeberg began an Introduction to Christianity through the Gospel of John, and Larissa Steadman began leading a Sunday Sermon Study every Wednesday evening.

The Preschool Staff took part in the Second Annual Trunk-or-Treat event on campus. Eight teachers participated and 54 children came to enjoy the fun event, which provided a safe and festive opportunity for families to gather together.

We held our second Family Christmas Party inviting both students and their families. The party was a festive evening filled with crafts, family photos, dinner, and meaningful fellowship. Also in December, 24 children sang Christmas songs during Preschool Sunday. This was a wonderful opportunity for our students to be involved and celebrated within the church community.

Our basketball focus is to have fun while introducing players and coaches to the game, teaching fundamental skills/ knowledge at an age appropriate level, and encouraging good sportsmanship.

At a minimum, we pray with the kids before each game, and our plan for 2026 is to do more to introduce these kids and their families to Christ and the church.

Homeless Outreach

We've appreciated being involved with and helping to minister to a special group of homeless guests during the winter months, by both encouraging and demonstrating God's love with many Windsor Christian Church members and volunteers. This was accomplished through the Nomadic Shelter/Entertaining Angels Events at WCC. We appreciate the support of this special team this past year which provided prayer, testimonies, music, fellowship, refreshments, food, desserts, set up, and clean up throughout the Nomadic Shelter events.

Nomadic Shelter Events

Nomadic Shelter operates during the winter months utilizing churches throughout Sonoma County to temporarily house 15-20 guests each night from October-April. The program offers an opportunity to offer love, hope, and a warm, safe place to sleep for the night along with a meal. The guests range in age and are both men, women, and occasionally children.

Windsor Christian Church hosts these events the 4th Friday of the month. We use the first floor of the Main Education Building, and typically set up at 5:00 PM. Guests arrive at 6:15 PM. Volunteers assist in setting up tables and chairs, supplying food, and help in serving, or participating in the meal. It's a blessing to those in attendance to interact and fellowship with our guests, get to know them, and allow them to share their stories. The evening consists of a time of prayer, devotional, dinner, and cleanup. Additionally, the Redwood Gospel Mission provides 2 chaperones to oversee and stay with the guests.

Much appreciation to David Jaramillo and Bonnie Riley for organizing the dinner menus. A special thanks to Marcie Mendenhall for providing wonderful desserts, coffee prepared and served by Bonnie, and table arrangements by Linnea. Redwood Gospel Mission Chapel Services

There is usually a crowd of 20-40 men and women attending the worship service which consists of music and a message. A meal is provided to those in attendance by RGM also. Pastors Lance Wallace, Steve Greene and members of Windsor Christian Church have participated in these Chapel services, given personal testimonies, and shared a message of the Gospel of Jesus. Music has been provided by Pastor Steve Greene, Andrew Gallagher, Richard Armantite, and Windsor Christian Academy students. As we look forward to 2026, we invite all our Windsor Christian Church family and friends to participate in both of these programs.

Missions

The goal of the missions ministry of Windsor Christian Church is to take the vision of WCC which is "...to present everyone complete in Christ" to the world beyond our community. You, as a part of WCC, play an important role in this ministry through prayer and financial support. Once again, WCC sent a team to Mountain Jewels Home to minister to those precious folks by putting on a Vacation Bible School, spending quality time with them, and encouraging them. It was a great time, and as usual, the team was blessed more than the folks they ministered to.

If you've ever been interested in what God is doing around the world, and what Windsor Christian Church is doing to support that, please consider joining the missions committee. We meet once a month on campus and we'd love to add a few new members.

Facilities

What a year! Looking back is always interesting, isn't it? We make plans. We have expectations. Rarely does it go exactly how we imagine. One of the joys of being on Facilities is that there are seldom dull moments and last year proved that true again. Even when plans shift, we still get to see how faithfully God provides and how we can continue trusting Him with what lies ahead.

2025 included several notable projects. The Worship Center Upgrade, while not fully complete, was by far the largest and has been a great success. From framing, sheetrock, painting, and electrical work to acoustic panels and major equipment upgrades, it has been a privilege to be part of transforming that space. We also replaced the old garden shed thanks to a generous donor who even installed it for us. The outdoor basketball court was repaved and painted, Cooper Donoho installed long awaited playground benches for his Scout Project, and we finally replaced the long overdue nursery door. One honorable mention goes to the gates system. Though technically a 2024 project, this was our first full year using it, and despite some ongoing tweaks, it has been a major security improvement.

It was a busy year, but there were also several large projects we were unable to complete due to time and budget constraints. One example is painting the exterior of the Main Education Building, which requires funding to hire a contractor. Looking ahead, many of our buildings are reaching an age where nearly everything is wearing out, from roofs and HVAC systems to paint, lighting, furniture, and more. Some especially pressing needs include roof and gutter repairs, repainting, fire alarm upgrades, HVAC work, and new sanctuary chairs.

Even with so much to do, it's a joy for our team to support nearly every ministry in some way. We are more than a maintenance crew. From repairing swings and helping with IT issues to setting up chairs, installing lights, handling trash, and supporting events, we get to serve in many different ways.

I want to thank the many people who have helped. Whether you joined a workday, moved chairs, picked up trash, cleaned, mowed, donated materials, or helped in other ways, your efforts haven't gone unnoticed. It's a blessing to serve alongside you to support God's people in this place.

If you'd like to also help our Facility here are some possible ways:

- Landscape maintenance: weed pulling, trimming shrubs, etc.
- Pressure washing sidewalks, tables, walls, more...
- Skilled trades: carpentry, electrical, plumbing, painting (plenty of tasks here!)

- Pray for God's continued provision




Financial Report

Monthly Giving Graph

The blue line shows our budgeted monthly giving receipts during 2025, while the bars show actual giving received. In summary, giving to the general budget in 2025 did not meet our budgeted goals but we have seen an increase each of the last 4-5 months and God has blessed us in a number of other ways. One of the biggest areas of blessing has been the Worship Center Project we began in 2025.
