**(1 COR 14:40)** - Let all things be done decently and in order.

### **LEADERSHIP**

#### **(NUM 11:16-17)**

- Every Pastor needs gifted, called, and committed leaders and officers (Dept. heads), that will commit to carrying the burden of caring for the people, and in turn reaching more people.

#### **(1 COR 12:27-31)**

- God appointed us, not man, and therefore each of our calling is just as important as the five-fold ministry gifts.
- We must individually give ourselves to our calling, taking time to study, pray, and develop ourselves to fulfill our calling.
- As each part of the body does their share, this will bring growth to the body and edifying of itself in love (Eph. 4:16).

#### **(HEB 13:7)**

- Have the kind of faith others can follow by setting an example for them.
- Fervency and vision are contagious and will spread automatically if the leaders are excited and severely dedicated to the cause.
- You are a carrier of the vision that God has given your pastor, so you must rub shoulders with others for them to catch it.
- Leadership is sharpened by the edge of adversity and the challenge of failure.
- It is impossible to be a true leader in any environment without the character traits of integrity, honesty, and ambition.

- Leadership, especially Christian leadership, is a constant lifestyle of developing yourself so that you can develop others.
- Leaders of quality always stand on principles, not practices. They do what is right, not what is popular.
- True leaders care for the troops and their well-being. They master keeping morale high, even in adverse conditions.
- Leaders are not the standard but rather those who hold up the standard.

### **(1 COR 1:10)**

- Quality leaders are the glue that keeps everything and everyone together.

## **COMMUNICATION**

- Communication is the lifeline to the troops. Without it men die, and companies drastically fail.
- To lead in any caliber, you must stay abreast the facts. Not only does your accuracy level depend on it, but also your integrity.
- There is no such thing as too much communications. It's the level and content of communications that need to be limited.
- Communications to the top keeps the leader informed and abreast the facts. This assures solid command, intelligent decisions, and safety for all the troops.
- Communications to the troops keep them on post and functioning according to the vision. It assures the elimination of confusion, stagnation, and stalemate.

## **DELEGATION**

- There is absolutely no way to delegate your position away or your need to manage, command, and communicate. You must fulfill these responsibilities.
- Delegation is not inheritance.
- Delegation has a definite string attached to the delegator.
- Delegation demands supervision and accountability.
- Delegation is always bound by parameters and limitations.
- Delegation requires clarity through repetition of instructions.
- Delegation is never considered ownership or possession.
- Delegated authority is authority that can be retrieved by the delegator.
- Delegation belongs to the delegator and always bears his name.
