Read God's Word Aloud

**1 John 1:5-2:2**

**1:5** This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. **6** If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. **7** But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. **8** If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. **9** If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. **10** If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

**2:1** My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. **2** He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

Discuss God's Word and God's World

**Important:** The goal is to use this Guide to spark sanctifying conversation and opportunities for intercessory prayer, not to “get through” every question like a checklist. Feel free to linger on the questions that best facilitate that for your group.

**Start here:** Take a few moments to share and reflect together on what stood out to you from this week’s Bible passage and the sermon about it.

- What is the message John heard and proclaimed? What stands out to you today about that message?
- 1 John 1:5b says, “God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.” What are the various implications of this truth? (see vs 6-10)
- Does our sin matter? Why or why not?

- Why would we lie and “say we have no sin”? (vs 8) What makes it difficult to recognize, admit, and confess our sin (to God and others believers)?
- What good comes from recognizing and confessing our sin? What bad comes from not doing so?
- In his sermon, Mike used the phrase “The Light reveals and the Light heals” to help us remember the truth of 1 John 1:5-2:2. What’s been your experience with God’s revelation of darkness in your life (1 John 1:5-10) and his healing of it (1 John 2:1-2)?
- In what ways are you walking in God’s light and enjoying the freedom of his forgiveness, advocacy, and propitiation? How are you struggling to?

*Sanctificational Prayer Guidance*

Bless and praise God for being our Light. Thank him for kindly revealing to us the darkness that separates us from him and each other; and for doing something about it.

*Father of lights, Jesus our substitute, Holy Spirit our advocate – we are humbled in gratitude that you have called us out of darkness into your marvelous light. Help us to open ourselves to your light. Help us to see clearly by that light. And help us to actively walk, obediently and humbly, in that light. For your glory, others’ good, and our joy.*

As you continue to explore the goodness of confession together, read 1 John 1:9 and 2:1-2 aloud for one another. Then rest comfortably, without guilt, in the truth that you are loved, forgiven, and redeemed. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you act in grateful and joyful obedience this week.
