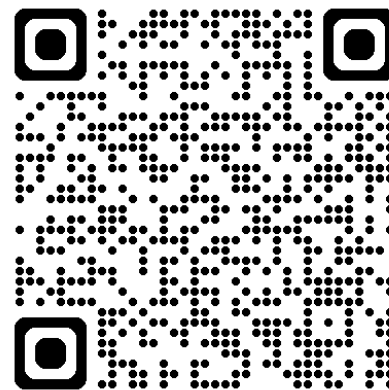




- Establishes us in the reality of our present
- Points us to the hope of our future

of sins.


