We were reminded last weekend that whatever we choose will be ours:

“He has placed before you fire and water: stretch out your hand for whichever you wish. Life and death are in front of people, and whichever one chooses will be given to him”.

This weekend our First Reading recalls the first time in history when humanity freely chose to disobey God.

We've been thinking about the Fall (or Original Sin) recently when unpacking the term 'Lamb of God', reminding ourselves of the connection between sin and sacrifice.

This season of Lent calls us to sacrifice. We are called to deny the self as we prepare to accompany the Lord into His Sacrifice, when He becomes the 'Scapegoat', offered as the Sacrificial Lamb for us on Good Friday, our Passover.

As we deny the self, as we say no to sin, we strengthen our character and our resolve to resist temptation.

If we can resist temptation the sin becomes less of a problem and we begin to love God above all things and our Neighbour as the self, keeping the Ten Commandments, making the **right choice**.

Fasting & Abstinence



Every Friday of the year is a day of self-denial. Each week we are given the opportunity to prepare for Lent.

Every Catholic is united on Fridays as we fast and abstain from eating meat. It is a religious dietary requirement for Catholics to refrain from eating meat every Friday.

Canon Law 1251 requires every Catholic to keep the Friday Fast.

Fridays should have a penitential feel to them as we consciously recall the Lord's Passion (Suffering) and Death.

If we eat meat on a Friday, we should confess this in our next Confession.

Fridays Prepare us for Lent From the Catechism:

1438 The seasons and days of penance in the course of the liturgical year (Lent, and each Friday in memory of the death of the Lord) are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice. These times are particularly appropriate for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies, pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works).

Family learning from the Catechism:

What does the Catechism say about Lent?:

1434 The interior penance of the Christian can be expressed in many and various ways. Scripture and the Fathers insist above all on three forms, fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, which express conversion in relation to oneself, to God, and to others. Alongside the radical purification brought about by Baptism or martyrdom they cite as means of obtaining forgiveness of sins: effort at reconciliation with one's neighbour, tears of repentance, concern for the salvation of one's neighbour, the intercession of the saints, and the practice of charity "which covers a multitude of sins."

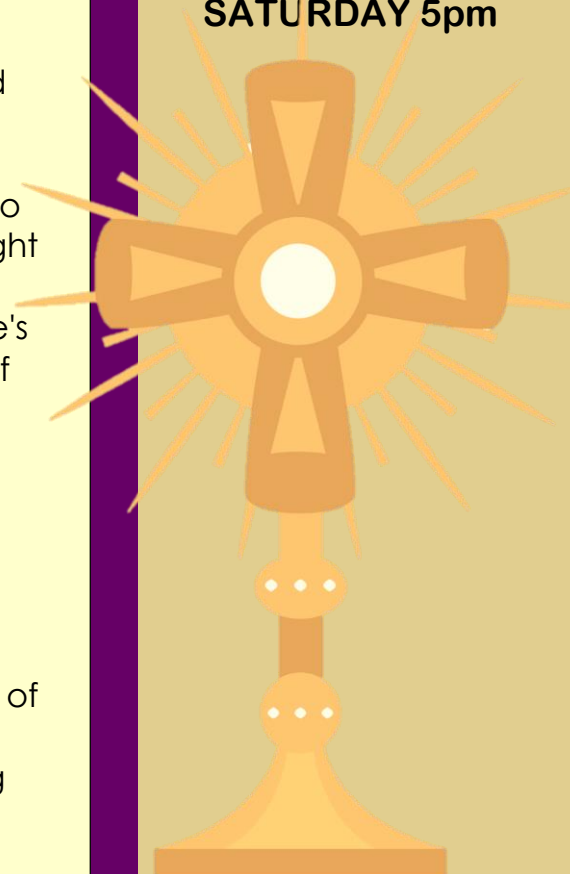
1435 Conversion is accomplished in daily life by gestures of reconciliation, concern for the poor, the exercise and defence of justice and right, by the admission of faults to one's brethren, fraternal correction, revision of life, examination of conscience, spiritual direction, acceptance of suffering, endurance of persecution for the sake of righteousness. Taking up one's cross each day and following Jesus is the surest way of penance.
