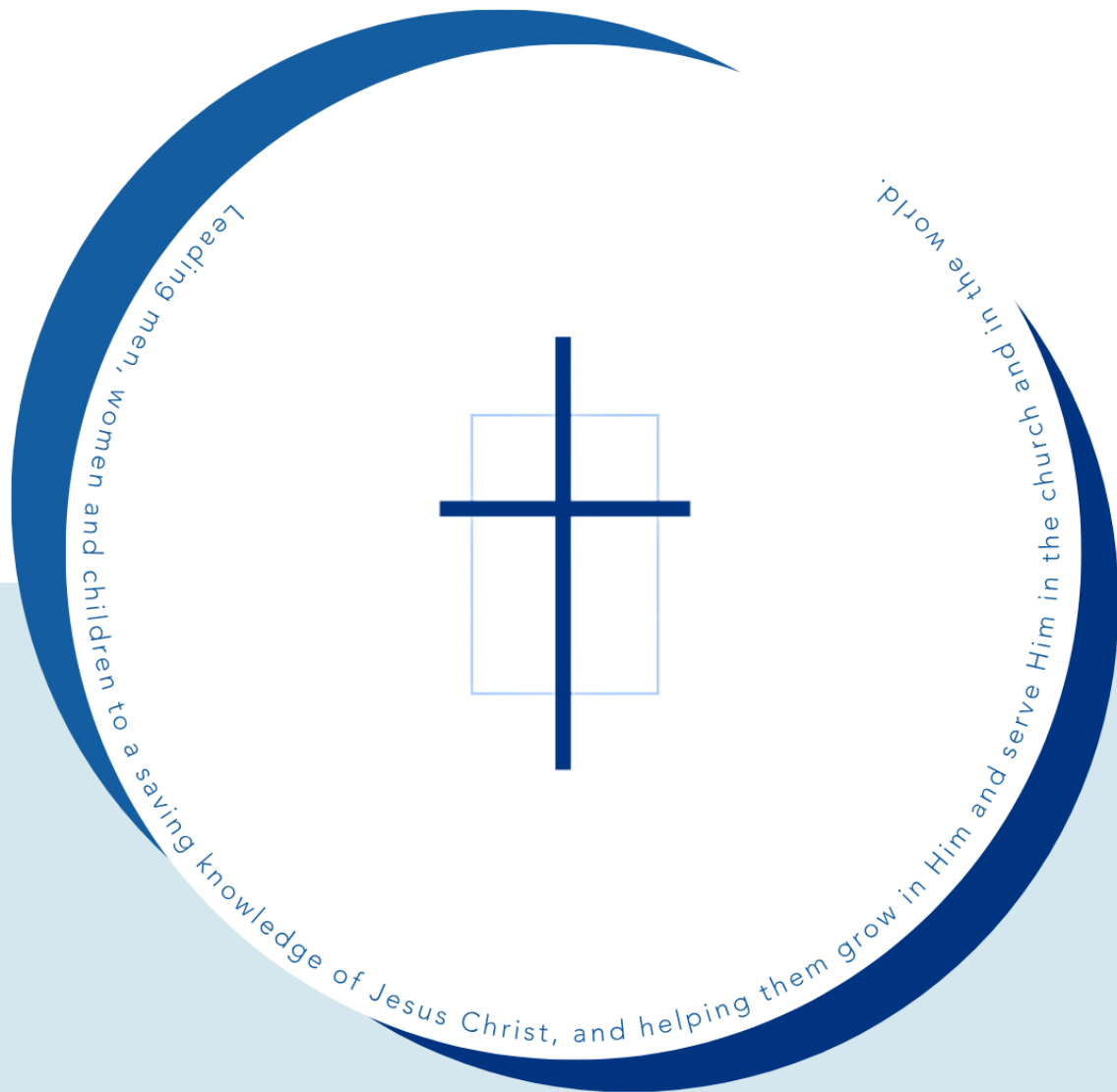

Westminster Larger Catechism, Q. 140 & 141

Leader: Let us declare what we believe the Scriptures teach: Which is the eighth commandment?

All: The eighth commandment is, Thou shalt not steal.

GOD
CLEANSES US
Within the context of our relationship with God, we are invited in safety, not shame, to consider our sins. God loves us in spite of our sins. We rehearse this truth each week by confessing our sins corporately and leaning into his renewal, restoration, and cleansing.

Leader: What are the duties required in the eighth commandment?

All: The duties required in the eighth commandment are, truth, faithfulness, and justice in contracts between man and man; rendering to everyone his due; restitution of goods unlawfully detained from the right owners thereof; giving and lending freely, according to our abilities, and the necessities of others; moderation of our judgments, wills, and affections concerning worldly goods; a provident care to get, keep, use, and dispose of these things which are necessary and convenient for the sustentation of our nature, and suitable to our condition; a lawful calling, and other like engagements; and an endeavor, by all just and lawful means, to procure, preserve, and further the outward estate of others, as well as our own.

CONFESSION OF SIN 1 Chr. 29:14; Ja. 1:17; Heb. 13:5; Ex. 20:15; Eph. 4:28

Leader: Let us now confess our sins together before our Lord:

All: Lord God, all things come from you. Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of light with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. Father, we are to be content with what we have. You commanded us not to steal. We confess that we have sinned against you and this eighth commandment. We have stolen what does not belong to us. We have stolen time from our employers. We have stolen from you in tithes and offerings. Forgive us, Lord. We repent of this sin of stealing. Let us steal no longer, but rather labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that we may have something to share with anyone in need. In your name. In Christ's Name. Amen.
