Such individuals are invited to speak with the pastor following the service.




FLOWERS FOR THE ALTAR

February 1 (Epiphany 4) – Tragically there are many people who do in fact sacrifice the fruit of their bodies for the sins of their soul (Micah 6:7), killing their own children to undo or cover up

the sinful choices they've made. How foolish is the so-called "wisdom" of the world (1 Corinthians 1) that calls death life! And though the Lord could rightly bring an indictment against His people for this evil (Micah 6:2), He instead shames the "strong" and "wise" among us by sacrificing His only begotten Son to cover the sins of the entire world (1 Corinthians 1:27-28). In Christ crucified, all who believe will inherit the kingdom of heaven, and those who mourn the wanton destruction of life will be comforted forevermore (Matthew 5:3-4).

Sunday School Corner



In our Winter unit, we continue our study of the New Testament, beginning with the account of Mary and Martha and continuing through Jesus appearing to Thomas. This morning, the kids studied the lesson "The Kingdom of Children – Jesus Blesses the Children." The disciples try to prevent the people from bringing their children to Jesus. Jesus rebukes the disciples and draws the children near to Himself, using a child as an example of how believers receive the kingdom of God.

To reinforce this lesson with your kids, as a family, discuss: What did Jesus do for the children in Mark 10:16? How does Jesus do the same for us? What would it feel like to get a hug from Jesus? Is Jesus saying we should always be children and not grow up? If you were holding a baby, what song would you sing to teach him or her about Jesus? Which song do you like to sing to remind you about how much Jesus loves you? Also, parents, you can join Pastor Krieg in the adult Sunday School class. See you next week!

High School Lesson


Our High School Sunday School class is beginning a new study series using Not-So-Nice Bible Stories: Master Criminals. In this engaging and thought-provoking study, students will explore the stories of some of Scripture's most notorious wrongdoers, and discover how God's mercy and grace still shine through even the darkest human deeds. Each lesson points us to Christ, who took the punishment for all sin upon Himself and gives us forgiveness, life, and salvation. Join us as we dig into God's Word, wrestle with tough questions, and see how even "master criminals" reveal our need for the one true Savior, Jesus Christ.

Lesson 8 – What's Yours Is Mine (2 Samuel 11-12)

In this week's lesson, our High School class explored King David's sin with Bathsheba and the murder of Uriah in "What's Yours Is Mine." Students confronted how power, desire, and self-justification led David to take what was not his and to cover sin with even greater sin. Through Nathan's confrontation, we saw how God's

Law exposes the heart and calls sin what it is. Yet this account does not end in despair. We also discussed how God's mercy met David in repentance and forgiveness, pointing us to Christ, the true King, who took our guilt upon Himself and restores sinners through His grace.

St. Paul's letter to the Romans is often called the "chief part of the New Testament." Romans clearly lays out the heart of the Christian faith: we are justified by grace alone through faith alone on account of Christ alone. In this rich epistle, Paul teaches on sin and righteousness, law and Gospel, baptism, the struggle against the old Adam, and life lived in the freedom of the Gospel. Whether you've

been attending or have yet to join us, this is a wonderful time to dig into God's Word together and grow in our understanding of His mercy in Christ. Come and be strengthened in the faith that saves and learn how the Gospel shapes our daily lives. We look forward to studying this treasure of Scripture with you! If you could not attend today, please join us next Sunday during the Adult Bible Study hour before church, starting at 9 a.m. Now is the time to commit yourself to a deeper and more meaningful understanding of God's Word and your relationship with Him.
