We recommend that every student label their luggage with their name & church name. OYM is not responsible for lost or stolen belongings.

Camp Expectations

We at OYM desire all students to use personal courtesy and Christian conduct habits to protect and ensure a positive atmosphere at camp. However, part of our mission as Christians is to evangelize and reach the lost. Therefore, it is highly likely that some students attending camp do not yet have a personal relationship with Jesus. Therefore, they will not be living with the same standard of behavior, communication, or attire. We ask that the Youth Pastor/Leaders kindly and gently help us ensure their students uphold the following expectations.

1. Campers' medication must be checked in to the camp Nurse at registration. All medication must be in its original container. This includes over-the-counter and natural remedies such as essential oils. Camp office and First-Aid will be open during posted hours. The Camp Nurse is on site 24/7. If the First-Aid office is closed, there will be a phone number for emergencies during those hours, to allow our nurses to rest.
2. No swapping or changing of rooms.
3. Girls and Guys are not allowed in the cabin rooms of the opposite sex.
4. Camp is not a place of public display of physical affection unless you are married.
5. No visitors are allowed at camp except credentialed ministers with the Assemblies of God. Only one person per bed and one person per shower. No students can enter the Coach or use the Coach's room or bathroom unless the camp director has approved an exception.
6. Camp vehicles (golf carts & four-wheelers) are to be used and driven by executive staff and interns only. Campers are only allowed to ride on these vehicles with permission or in case of emergency. Church and personal vehicles are to be locked and may not be entered during the camp.
7. All students need to be modest in their apparel. No spaghetti straps, tight-fitting clothing, or anything that exposes the midriff. Clothing should not display or promote drug substances or inappropriate language. Skirts and dresses, and shorts should be around fingertip length. Casual dress is acceptable for the evening service. Please, no pajamas. Students must wear shoes and shirts at all times outside the cabins.
8. No hazing or bullying of any kind will be tolerated by students or adults. This includes actions and comments.
9. Willful destruction of camp or personal property will not be tolerated.
10. No pushing or throwing anyone in the water.
11. No throwing rocks. Please keep the rocks on the walkways and out of the grass.
12. Stay in lighted areas of camp at all times.
13. Jewelry should be taken out or covered during competitive activities to avoid injuries.
14. No towel popping of any kind (using any other materials) anywhere on the campground.

Camp is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen items.

What to pack:

Pillow

Twin bedding (sheets & blanket or sleeping bag)

Towel (one for swimming, one for shower)

Soap, shampoo, conditioner, etc.

Toothbrush & toothpaste

Deodorant

Sunscreen, Insect repellent, sunglasses, hat/visor

Casual/Nice clothes for service

Athletic clothes for games (at least one game is in the mud)

Athletic Shoes for games and activities

Swimming clothes or suit (colored shirt and shorts are required over swimsuits)

Drawstring backpack

Bible and notebook

Reusable water bottle

Plastic bags for wet/muddy clothes

Extra money for concessions & merch (we take cash check and card)

What NOT to pack:

A bad attitude

Any personal electronics (smartwatches, cell phones, etc. There is a potential for damage with high temperatures, rain, mud, rocks, lake water, and other factors of risk to damage or theft of a phone.

Illegal substances (Alcohol, tobacco, vapes, and illegal drugs are strictly prohibited. This includes any non-prescription cannabis products.)

Weapons (No weapons or explosives of any kind are allowed at camp, including all types of guns, pocket knives, fireworks, etc.)

Youth Pastors/Leaders tips:

Hamper/Laundry bag

Extension cord

Portable Fan

Sleep mask

Scissors/Duct Tape/Safety pins

Extra everything for your students who forget (bedding, towels, and toiletries)

Please do not bring:

1. Any skateboards, scooters, motorcycles or bicycles- not allowed on the camp property.
2. Outside Food or Drink. No Food is allowed in cabins. This allows us to avoid issues with bugs and rodents. Concessions are available for purchase at camp outside of regular meal times.
3. Any personal electronic devices are not allowed in the camp (smartwatches, cameras, tablets, iPod etc.)

This includes cell phones. We prefer all students to leave their cell phones at home. We know the importance of this generation being able to disconnect for a week and allow God to move and speak to them and make new friends! We also know the high risk involved at our camp with high temperatures, rain, mud, rocks, lake water, and other risk factors to damage or steal a phone. However, this decision is ultimately up to each group's youth pastor. **Your Youth Pastor will be responsible for the enforcement of our request. OYM is not responsible for any cell phones.**

Campers may be immediately sent home upon violations of the following expectations.

This means a parent or guardian will be required to come to camp to check them out and take them home. Camp leadership reserves the right to search for and hold and/or dispose of improper personal belongings.

1. Alcohol, tobacco, vapes, and illegal drugs are strictly prohibited. This includes any illegal cannabis products.
2. No weapons or explosives of any kind are allowed at camp, including all types of guns, pocket knives, fireworks, etc.
3. Any camper caught out of their room after lights out will be sent home immediately.
4. No one is to leave the camp without permission from the camp office. Any vehicle entering or exiting the camp must check out with the security guard at the gate with proper documentation from the camp office. The gate is guarded 24/7.

Notes for Parents

If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the youth pastor or leader of the group your student is attending with.

Contacting your student while at camp

It is highly recommended that you have the cell phone number of the youth pastor or leader of

the group that your student is attending with. This will be the best way for you to reach your student if there is an emergency.

As previously communicated, we at OYM do not allow campers to have phones at camp, but we ultimately leave this up to the Youth Pastor of each group to enforce.

Your student and their leaders will be very busy at camp, so we ask that you refrain from frequently contacting them. This week is an important and valuable time for your student to disconnect from their normal routine and fully engage in the camp experience, focusing on allowing God to speak into their life. For this reason, we ask that you reserve contact with your student for emergencies only.

If your student needed or wanted to contact you for some reason, they would be free to do so through their youth leader or the camp office phone.
